

Articles & Information

Digitising the village archives for everyone to see

For 2 months now we have been working with the Village Archive Group to digitise all of the documents, maps, and other items from the archive that has been collected over the years. There is a massive variety of fascinating archive material that has been categorised by the Archive Group which has made our job that much easier. But these hard copies will not last forever; fading is evident on some of the documents and rust is slowly working away at staples and other bindings. With this in mind, by digitising them we are able to create a lasting store that people can both enjoy at the current moment of time and, in the future when it is all finally loaded onto the cloud device (purchased with a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund), from anywhere in the world where they are able to access the internet.

The way we are able to digitise all the intriguing documents, maps, minute's books, pictures etc is by scanning them with one of two scanners which were also bought with funds from the grant received from the Heritage Lottery Fund to help with the project. Due to the massive variety of shape, size and number of archive material, both an A4 and A3 scanner are used. This allows us to make sure we have a scanner that is able to scan the material whatever the shape or size.

We have both been so fascinated with the material we have been scanning and have enjoyed learning about things to do with the village that we had no idea about before we started. Furthermore, it has been so intriguing just to see how much the village has changed but also seeing how many traditions have survived. Harvest Over.....Another Farming Year Begins

In my last update for the May Bugle, I said that the rainfall patterns to date in 2017 were similar to the famous hot, dry years of 1976 and 2003 and that a sunny Summer beckoned. How wrong I was! I should know better than to prejudge the English weather! My prognostication held reasonably well until the end of June but then the rains began to arrive, especially so from mid-July.

In July we recorded rainfall of 92.4mm against a ten-year average of 64.8mm. In September there has been 85mm to date against a ten-year average of 37.60mm. This has resulted in a difficult Harvest in terms of operations and a slow start to the drilling campaign for next year's crops, especially the Wheat. And it has certainly curbed opportunities for barbeques which I had forecast would be the mainstay of this Summer!

Harvest – Above Average

The very dry start to the year implied that yields for this Harvest would not be particularly good. However, this heavy clay land retains its winter moisture for a long time and the crops looked surprisingly well as Summer approached. They were also about ten days ahead of their normal growing pattern. Therefore, when the serious rains began, the damage to the crops was relatively small (and indeed it helped certain things such as Wildbird Seed Mixes – see below) although it meant that the Harvest was a stop/start affair as the showers were dodged by the combines.

The yields of most crops, such as the Wheat, were average to slightly above average. Indeed, the Oilseed Rape was the best since 2003 – it is a crop which benefits from relatively hot, dry weather which, of course, prevailed in the Spring and early Summer of this year. There was however a noticeable difference between what we call First Wheats and Second Wheats. The first Wheats, which are the significant majority, are drilled behind break crops such as Oilseed Rape and Beans. Some of the First Wheats, such as Skyfall and Illustrious which are the Milling Wheat varieties, did exceptionally well. However, the Second Wheats, which follow on directly from a previous crop of Wheat, did poorly. Their root structures were probably particularly affected by the draught earlier in the year. Conversely the Sugar Beet, which we are currently harvesting, benefitted enormously from the late rains. After it was initially planted in late March it looked as if it might even fail due to the lack of rain. However, the rains since mid-Summer came just in time and we await the results with some optimism!

Countryside Stewardship

The wet weather of the last three months has been of great benefit to the various areas of Wildflower and Wildbird Seed Mixes which some of you will have noted on your walks.

The Grass and Floristic Mixes – for example on Hobbs Croft which is the field on the right immediately over Bradley Bridge – have flourished in the late Summer and should be a picture next year! Aside from the abundance of clover, vetch, birdsfoot trefoil and black knapweed, it was particularly good that the musk mallow emerged.

The Winter Wildbird Seed Mixes - which we have been growing for about fifteen years (but now more than ever before) - have never looked better. The millets and the phacelia have thrived in particular.

We are also seeing the benefit of the new Autumn Wildbird Seed Mixes which we initially planted last year. These provide assistance to birds in the late Winter and to insects and birds from the Spring onwards. They are providing a tremendous boost to habitat for wildlife.

This is a somewhat shorter update than usual but I will be writing with further news in November!
